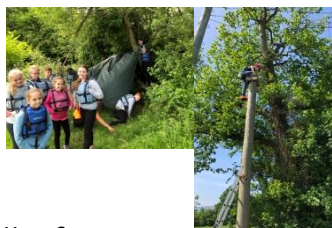


Headteacher Newsletter June 2018
