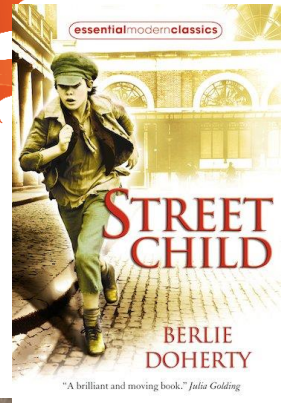


Year Six Newsletter – Term 2
