

# Behaviour policy: coronavirus addendum

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## 1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice.

It sets out changes and exceptions to our normal behaviour policy. Pupils, parents and staff should continue to follow our normal behaviour policy with respect to anything not covered in this addendum.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes. We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and pupils.

## 2. Expectations for pupils in school

### 2.1 New rules

When pupils are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact the Headteacher if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them and support them to integrate back into school life.

Details of rules in line with the [latest government guidance for full opening of schools](#)

- › Altered routines for arriving or leaving the school - parent and children to stay 2m apart as per floor marking and follow the routes marked for arriving and leaving. The office will be closed at these times.
- › Hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising – All staff, visitors and children are expected to regularly follow the hygiene procedures. Hand should be sanitised on entering and exiting any part of the building but also before and after eating.
- › Bubbles – Children will remain in their bubbles at all times and break in to group of up to four children to play together during break, lunch and P.E lessons
- › Moving around the school – Visitors, staff and children will follow the one way systems when moving around the school. There should be no need to pass in corridors. Everyone must keep to 2m distancing where possible
- › Sneezing, coughing, tissues and disposal ('catch it, bin it, kill it') and avoiding touching their mouth, nose and eyes with hands – Everyone expected to follow the Catch it, bin it, kill it to contain sneezes and coughs. Bins will be emptied regularly.
- › Telling an adult if they are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus – All children will be reminded to tell an adult if they are feeling unwell, social stories have been made to support SEND children with this.
- › Resources – All resources will be individual and cleaned between uses. Children will be reminded daily not to share resources. Specific resources will be made available to the child from the start of the day.
- › Breaks or play times – will be supervised fully children will be reminded of where to play and how.

- › Use of toilets – toilets will be labelled specific to their class and children will be supervised when going to ensure they go to the correct place

## 2.2 Rewards and sanctions for following rules

To help encourage pupils to follow the above rules, we will:

Praise regularly

Whole class chart, points for following rules and weekly social distancing reward for class with highest points

Flourishing awards – children named via Kidblog celebration assembly with reason and certificate fortnightly

However, if pupils fail to follow these rules, we will:

If a child is repeatedly not following social distancing rules – this will be explained to them and support with understanding the importance. If this is repeated purposefully, parents will be contacted to clearly explain the seriousness of this behaviour. Finally a child may be asked to learn from home for a period of time

## 2.3 Changed rules

Until further notice, we will alter the following school rules:

- › Expectations for attendance – Currently attendance is flexible and only recorded to support vulnerable. As per the [latest government guidance](#) attendance will be mandatory from September and we will revert back to normal expectations for attendance
- › Expectations for uniform –All pupils must wear uniform to school and follow normal school rules on uniform as set out in our behaviour policy. If pupils cannot wear their full uniform, parents should contact the Headteacher.

## 3. Expectations for pupils at home

### 3.1 Remote learning rules

If pupils are not in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure their children follow them. Parents should contact the Headteacher if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them and support them with their learning.

- › Seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants
- › Use proper online conduct, such as using appropriate language in messages

## 4. Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated by Headteacher At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
