**Enhanced Learning Outcomes**: Cooperative learning has been shown to improve understanding and retention of material. Kagan structures promote peer teaching, allowing students to explain concepts to one another, reinforcing their own understanding.

**Diverse Learning Styles Supported**: Kagan structures accommodate various learning styles and needs. Whether through visual, auditory, or kinesthetic activities, these strategies engage all students, helping them grasp concepts in ways that resonate with them.

### Curriculum

- Our Curriculum builds on knowledge and skills that the children acquire in the infants.
- We use a range of elements to develop learning in to the term memory for children.
- Children in year 3 and 4 work across Milestone 2. Year 5 and long6 work across Milestone 3.
- We repeat learning areas and deepen learning to ensure that learning is embedded in to long term memory.
- We use quizzing and recaps to ensure learning is linked to long term memory
- Knowledge categories are used within subjects to focus children and link learning together.





### **Outcomes 2024 – Key Headlines**

- A further 10% improvement on outcomes from 2023
- 30% improvement in attainment since 2022
- Reading outcomes above National Outcomes.
